

St. Andrew's School



Headmaster Daniel T. Roach, Jr., appointed in 1997, is the School's fourth headmaster.

Location St. Andrew's is a mid-Atlantic boarding school located in Middletown, Delaware, 30 minutes south of Wilmington, easily accessible to Philadelphia (1 hr.), Washington, D.C. (2 hrs.), Baltimore (1.5 hrs.) and New York City (2.5 hrs.).

The School Founded by A. Felix duPont in 1929 as an Episcopal Church boarding school, St. Andrew's serves young men and women in grades 9-12 (III-VI Forms) from across the nation and around the world. St. Andrew's is a fully residential community (100% boarding) of highly engaged students and teachers living in an atmosphere defined by kindness, trust, high expectations and compassion.

Academic Program The Harkness table classrooms combined with the Oxford-tutorial method of teaching allow for open discourse and the development of critical thinking and problem-solving skills across all disciplines. The average class size is 11 students; the student teacher ratio is 5:1.

Admission St. Andrew's seeks bright, motivated students from the broadest spectrum of backgrounds and experiences who are ready to fully engage in and take advantage of all that St. Andrew's offers. Each year over 450 students apply for about 75 available places; this past year 459 students applied and 82 new students enrolled.

Financial Aid Our Founder's mission was that St. Andrew's would be a school serving "bright students of good character regardless of their ability to pay." To that end, St. Andrew's continues to practice need-blind admission and to fully meet demonstrated need. This year 46% of our students receive need-based grants totaling \$5 million. The average grant is \$36,000.

Campus & Facilities St. Andrew's

is situated on 2,200 acres of farmland, woods, wetlands and open fields that enhance our learning environment. Our open fields include ten athletic fields, 14 tennis courts, a paddle tennis court and an organic garden. Our campus includes Noxontown Pond, a 2.5 mile, six-lane crew course and recreational boating resource.

Three major academic buildings—Founders Hall, Amos Hall and the O'Brien Arts Center—are complemented by our athletic facilities: the Genereux Aquatic Center, the Sippelle Field House and Athletic Center, and the Kip duPont Boathouse. The A. Felix duPont, Jr. Memorial Chapel and the Irene duPont Library are cornerstones of our main building, Founders Hall. Boys live on the second and third floors of Founders Hall, while girls are housed in five separate dormitories. The Miller Heath Center is located in the center of campus, overlooking Noxontown Pond.

College Counseling 100% of our

graduates attend competitive four-year colleges. Five college counselors guide our students through the process of researching, testing, visiting and applying to college, beginning in the fall of their V Form year. Occasionally students will defer to participate in a "gap-year" of service, work or travel.
